The following questions were received and responses are provided:

1. To become credentialed through Medicare, an OTP has to be fully certified which takes a year from the opening date. For a new OTP facility opening in Dane County, would this deadline be extended?

Opioid Treatment Providers (OTPs) in the proposed program are expected to enroll in Medicare and bill Part B benefit for Medicare beneficiaries with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD). An OTP opening a new facility in Dane County would be expected to apply for and receive provisional certification as it is working towards becoming accredited by a SAMHSA-approved OTP accrediting body. The provisional certification is a temporary certification granted to a new OTP for up to one year, during which time the OTP must become fully accredited. After a provisionally certified program becomes accredited, it must apply to SAMHSA for full certification and then enroll in Medicare. In the event a contract for services is awarded to a new OTP in Dane County, Dane County would grant the time necessary (approximately one year from opening) to complete the full certification process and enrollment in Medicare.

2. With the tight timeline of award notice and end of the grant period, will a SOR No Cost Extension be available to help spend down the funding? The initial capacity building period, which runs from the contract execution date through September 29, 2021, is funded by State Opioid 1- No Cost Extension funds. No additional state or federal grant funding extension is available for these funds. The second capacity building and service delivery period, which runs from September 30, 2021 through September 29, 2022, is funded by State Opioid Grant 2. Dane County anticipates that state and federal funding authorities will provide a SOR 2 No Cost Extension, but that extension is not guaranteed.

3. Should service delivery be submitted in the in the budget or will those be funded separately? The proposed budget should include direct consumer care services to individuals who are not covered by public or commercial health insurance programs and/or individuals for whom health care coverage has been formally determined to be unaffordable. Funding for these services will determined and authorized by Dane County and based on Medicaid rates.
